On Saturday, we took 37 people from our parishes to our Altar Server Youth Trip for a hockey game at the Utica Aud. We then co-hosted the Hamilton Ecumenical Youth Group on Sunday, where 15 high school teens showed up from various Christian denominations. Then on Monday we hosted Catholic Youth Night at St. Mary's, where we had a full house of our high school teens who participated in exciting icebreakers, and then got into some real time for silent prayer and reflection. It was truly amazing to see how they sincerely prayed! I then had the opportunity to lead the Holy Hour on Colgate's campus for the Newman students as well as serve a delicious Lebanese dinner. It was such special time for prayer and fellowship for our Catholic young adults. The reason why I share all this is that I am finally beginning to feel the connection our parish is making with our young people in the area. We are engaging them in a very real way, and it brings the greatest of joys to my heart. They are the future of the Church, and there is nothing I pray for more than our young people to find strength in our Faith community. I am also blown away that we only have two more spots left on our Catholic Youth Trip to St. John's University this summer! The trip is almost full! God is good!
