**FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE**

Last week, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrated National Migration Week. This coming week we begin to fast and pray for the protection of all human life from the moment of conception until natural death. I believe these two issues are intimately related and necessarily connected to one another. If we believe that the unborn child in the womb deserves the right to life just as much as any other citizen in our nation, so too should our respect for all human life extend itself to the immigrant and refugee. All human beings are made in the image and likeness of God, which means that we are called to see God in the face of every human person. The Catholic who believes in the right to life must be the voice for all those who are voiceless. So for the unborn child as well as for the immigrant and refugee, we are called to be guardians and protectors. I would like to share with you this statement that our Bishop Robert Cunningham released last week as he welcomed migrants and refugees to our cathedral in Syracuse for special Mass in their honor:

“It is once again a poignant time to remind ourselves that immigrants and refugees from *every* country enrich our local communities. Their contributions to the fabric of our society are everywhere evident. Here in Upstate New York, so many of our parents and grandparents came from Europe and built this community. In recent years immigrants from Latin America, Asia, and Africa, to name just a few, have done the same. Our community is rich because of the diverse gifts of its people. As we reach the end of National Migration Week, may we look at no one as an outsider but embrace all as persons created in God's image and likeness. Although there are many journeys, we are one family. I pray that all will find here a place of welcome and be at peace. Today's immigrants want what we all do—a place to raise our families in peace and love.”
