FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

Dear all, the last time I celebrated Mass at Madison Lane on a First Friday, I had a dialogue with the attendees about the possibility of finding another time we could gather for prayer. The conversation went very well, and people were most gracious when I was vulnerable with them about my personal needs. I explained to those present at the Mass that Friday is my one day away from the office and the only day I can visit my family and friends. My parents live two hours and fifteen minutes away in one direction and my three siblings live four hours away in the other direction. Without my family's support, I would not be able to be the priest I am today. Therefore, it is essential that I keep them as a regular part of my life. Again, our parishioners who were present were most gracious.

Together, we came up with the option of having a Communion Service at Madison Lane every second Tuesday of the month at 9:00 AM. That way, I can celebrate the Communion Service at Madison Lane and then head over to the Mass I celebrate at Crouse Community Center every second Tuesday in Morrisville at 10:00 AM. I will also be visiting the sick and the homebound of our parishes the first week of every month, instead of on Friday. When I visited the sick and homebound last month, they all agreed that it does not matter on which day they receive, as long as they receive. I told them that I will never walk away from a pastoral need in our parish, but because of my many duties in Hamilton and Morrisville as well as in the diocese, I have to be creative with my schedule in order to continue to meet the needs of everyone involved as well as take into consideration my own personal needs.

You will soon find out that I have many other roles in our diocese outside of our parish communities. One example I will provide you is that the bishop asked me two years ago to be the coordinator for all college-age men in our diocese who are discerning the priesthood. With the shortage of priests in our diocese, many of our priests are taking on various roles in order to assist in the greater diocesan mission of evangelization and vocation promotion. So what does the mean for us? Firstly, pray along with me for an increase in vocations to the priesthood. Secondly, please be willing to step up to assist me with our ministries in the parish. I cannot do this without you...and I think that is a beautiful thing. We can all get involved, and I know so many of you have gifts and talents that can be shared for the building up of the Kingdom. Mary Immaculate and Saint Joan of Arc, pray for us!

Have You Noticed the New Art in Our Sanctuary?

The name of the bas-relief sculpture is the Pitti Tondo (a round piece of sculpture commissioned by the Pitti family), and was given to St. Mary's by Carol Bergin this past spring. It is a plaster cast of the original marble sculpture by Michelangelo that was done between the years 1503 and 1504. The original is in the Museo Nazionale del Bargello in Florence, Italy. It depicts Mary with the infant Jesus leaning against her, and behind her shoulder is St. John the Baptist. We are very lucky to have such a stunning piece of art in our sanctuary.
