FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

I would like to express my deepest gratitude to you all for the very warm welcome you extended to me last weekend. Your kindness and gratitude made a deep impression on me as I begin my time here in Hamilton and Morrisville. I cannot tell you how much your hospitality encouraged me and strengthened me as I begin this new chapter in my life.

If you were not able to make Mass last weekend, I would like to share with you now a little bit about myself. I grew up in Brockport, NY. My father owns his own flooring business and was the varsity basketball coach at Brockport High School for 20 years. My mother is a retired teacher. She taught for 20 years in a Catholic elementary school. I have three siblings, two brothers and a sister. My oldest brother lives with his wife in Long Island and works for a hedge fund in Manhattan. They just had their first son. My nephew is now five months old (and he is the joy of my heart). My youngest brother lives in Manhattan and works for Salesforce. He played Division I basketball for Fordham University. My sister works as an ESL teacher in Manhattan. She spent the last two years teaching in the nation of Colombia, achieving fluency in the Spanish language. She also played basketball in college for Union College. I am very close to my family. Without their love and support, I would not be the priest I am today.

Here are a few fun facts about myself. When I was on the varsity hockey team in high school, we brought home two sectional titles and a state title. I love the game of hockey (I also love to play any sport). I did not consider a vocation to the priesthood until I was graduating from high school. I attended Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. I applied to the seminary after I graduated from Xavier. I attended Saint Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland (it is the oldest Catholic seminary in the U.S.). I was ordained a priest on June 7, 2014. I spent my first three years as a priest at Holy Family Church in Syracuse. It is the largest parish in our diocese, comprising 3,500 families as well as an elementary school. This past May, Bishop Cunningham asked me to consider Saint Mary's and Saint Joan of Arc as my next assignment. I was deeply humbled that he considered me for this assignment, and I can tell you it is my privilege to serve in this capacity as your administrator. Know that I will give you my undivided love and attention.

Please pray for me as I continue to listen to God's voice in this new role. Know that I will *always* be praying for you.
