I feel the need to mention that something Steve was very passionate about was collaboration and fellowship between St. Mary's and St. Joan's. He was someone who truly united both communities by his actions and his words, and I pray that we can continue to honor his legacy in striving to keep St. Mary's & St. Joan's one faith community united in love. Daily Mass Update

Public Daily Masses will begin on Monday, June 15. We will no longer be doing a pre-registration system for our daily Masses, but will now be allowing walk-ins. Parish Family Rosary (Homes United in Prayer)

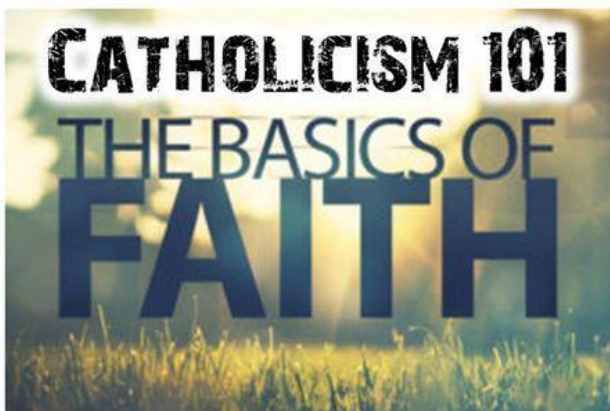
