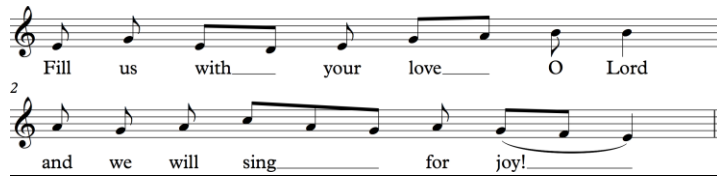

Did you know that Altar Rosary Society makes prayer shawls? Do you know what they are? Knitters and crocheters please take note! Winter is coming and evenings are cooler. We at ARS can use your talents. This is a ministry that creates shawls for our parishioners who are homebound, in hospitals, nursing homes, undergoing chemotherapy, are challenged with health problems, or someone who is just lonely. We also donate them to the Physical Therapy Department at our hospital. They are made with your yarn of choice. The suggested patterns are simple. We have printed instructions available. When we make the shawls, we say some prayers as we begin, praying for the person who will receive it. We like to think we are doing "Gods work with our hands." We pray the person receiving it is cradled in hope, graced in peace, and wrapped with love. We like to think that they are passed on hand to hand and heart to heart, and always with a little hug from God. This is a labor of love—no commitment, and no specific time to finish. You can finish the shawl at your leisure.
